









































































ON 25<sup>th</sup> MAY 2018, ANTONY GORMLEY'S FIRST PUBLIC COMMISSION, **PLACES TO BE**, WAS RE-SITED ON THE ROOFTOPS OF QUEENSGATE, THE LEEDS BUILDING SOCIETY AND THE NORWICH BUILDING SOCIETY, THE THREE LIFE-SIZED LEAD BODY CASES HAVING PREVIOUSLY BEEN SITED OUTSIDE GREENWOOD'S SOLICITORS AT TOUTHILL CLOSE, CITY ROAD IN THE 1980s AND PREVIOUS TO THAT AT THE CITY'S ROWING LAKE. ON THIS DAY SIR ANTONY GORMLEY WAS MADE A MEMBER OF THE ORDER OF COMPANIONS.




































terborough Civic o

The earliest TOWN BRIDGE. in timber, was built

here in 1307. Its successor was replaced by an iron bridge in 1872. The present reinforced concrete bridge was opened in 1934.

TOWN HALL

erected 1929-33 following demolition of the east side of former Narrow Bridge Street. Architect: E. Berry Webber Contractor: Thompson and Sons

This LIDO

(originally named the Corporation Swimming Pool) was opened in May 1936. Designed 'hacienda-style'. it is considered one of the finest surviving examples in England.

CIVIC SOCIETY'S

Built in 1816 this was the private house of Thomas Alderson Cooke J.P. After his death in 1854 it was acquired by Earl Fitzwilliam and used as an infirmary until 1928.

Since 1931 it has housed Peterborough Museum.

ogterborough Civic o Site of the PARISH BURIAL GROUND

in use from 1805 to 1858. Prior to this a lay cemetery to the north of the Cathedral had been used After 1858 Broadway Cemetery was established

sorough Civic S PLAQUES

Site of the original DEACON'S SCHOOL founded by wool merchant Thomas Deacon in 1721 for 20 boys to learn to 'read. write and cast accounts'. The school buildings remained in use here until 1882

36 BLUE

oterborough Civic Near this spot stood the office of JOHN ADDY.

chartered engineer (1847-1896) who designed and commissioned Peterborough's first public water supply and drainage systems in 1874-1880, greatly reducing the incidence of infectious disease

on this site lived SIMON GUNTON

(1609-1676) Vicar of Peterborough during the Great Plague, historian and Prebendary of the Cathedral. His book 'The History of the Church of Peterburgh' was published in 1686

orborough Civic,

The first floor of this building was host to a WORLD WAR ONE RECRUITMENT OFFICE between 1914 - 1917 where many locals arrived to enlist in order to serve King and Country.

rerborough Civic o

This 18th Century building, known as THE CUSTOMS HOUSE served as a granary and warehouse where goods were stored until dues were paid. Sea Cadets occupied the building from 1942.

THOMAS JAMES WALKER 1835 - 1916

lived and practised here. He was a distinguished physician. surgeon and antiquary. Four of his 15 children became doctors.

SHOPPING ARCADE was built 1927-28 to link the ancient streets of Westgate and Cumbergate. Its architect was A.W. Ruddle who owned the site jointly with

Fitzwilliam Estates.

Site of the ANGEL INN.

Originally an abbey property it became a busy mail and coaching inn. As the

ANGEL HOTEL it was demolished in 1972.

Site of a chapel dedicated to ST THOMAS BECKET murdered in 1170.

It was completed shortly afterwards for pilgrims venerating relics of Becket brought here from Canterbury.

This building, known as THE GUILDHALL.

was erected in 1671 to celebrate the restoration of the monarchy in 1660. It became part of Peterborough's council chambers until they were replaced by the present Town Hall

in 1933.

to survive in Peterborough. CUMBERGATE is a medieval name meaning

'Street of the wool-combers'.

This late 15th Century

building is one of the few

timber-framed buildings
